



Introduction to ForeverGreen Trails

About ForeverGreen Trails: The Mission of ForeverGreen Trails is to support a system of trails throughout Pierce County, WA, via education, advocacy, promotion, collaboration, and stewardship. We do this through our programs, events, and projects, which:

- Educate and involve the public and create partnerships (Trails & Ales and Pierce County Trails Day)
- Foster networking, discussion, and training (Pierce County Trails Conference)
- Recognize and celebrate achievements (Trails Scorecard and Trail Awards programs)
- Help raise funds in financial partnerships and support trail grant applications
- Provide a forum for local jurisdictions and other stakeholders to foster coordination and accelerated trail development

History Brief: In 2000, FGT arose out of a public discussion about Pierce County's future and concerns about having recreational resources for a growing population. It quickly evolved to focus on a county-wide system of trails and provided a forum for jurisdictions to develop a regional trail map and an implementation strategy. This strategy included provision of technical staff and resources to support trail planning and development at the local level. This ambitious approach was not pursued, however because the mechanism to fund it (a fraction of a percentage of sales tax) was not enabled by the Legislature. The organization instead has pursued public promotion of and education about trails, as well as non-technical support for implementing the regional trails system through involvement as a trails stakeholder in public processes and in active recreation and mobility coalitions.

Organizational Chart: FGT has a very simple structure:



NOTES:

- **The Board** establishes standing or temporary committees per the Bylaws. Certain powers are reserved for the Board alone. The Board meets a minimum of six times a year.
- **The Executive Committee (EC)** may act on behalf of the Board on time sensitive issues but must report those actions at the next Board meeting. The Board annually elects its Officers who serve on the Executive Committee. The EC usually meets on months the Board does not.
- **The Organizational Development Committee (ODC)** provides financial and human resource development assistance for the Board. The ODC meets as needed by the Board.
- **The Trails Conference Planning Committee** handles the structure and logistics for the annual fall conference. This optional committee only meets as needed during the year, often just before the board meeting.
- **The Executive Director** is hired by the Board and staffs all committees. They tend to be in frequent communication with the President and Treasurer, outside of meetings.
